Policies, Plans & Procedures

Key Safety Programs

YZC has also recently revised or developed the following programs:

1. Formal Risk Assessment
2. Job Hazard Analysis
3. Safety Card System, which includes 5 point safety, job site requirements, field level risk assessment and near miss reporting

JOHSC

A Joint Occupational Health and Safety Committee was established at the Wolverine Mine in 2009. The committee provides a forum where employer and worker representatives jointly identify, assess, and control health and safety hazards. Activities and outcomes are communicated to workers, managers, and supervisors. The Wolverine JOHSC conducts monthly workplace inspections and meetings, and addresses workplace safety issues in a timely manner as required.

Training at Wolverine Mine

In 2010, YZC has completed a wide range of training programs at Wolverine Mine in the areas of safety, employee development and equipment. Training programs will continue to be developed and executed during startup and into production.
